I. INTRODUCTION

J.F. & H. Dowds Ltd (trading as Dowds Group) remain fully committed to compliance with the Modern Slavery Act 2015 ("Act") in all its divisions, not only in its own dealings but in those of its supply chain.

2. ORGANISATION STRUCTURE

Dowds Electrical (Holdings) Limited is the ultimate parent company of Dowds Group, an independent and family-owned business employing approximately 170 people and providing provides Electrical, Mechanical and Integrated Services. We have an annual turnover of approximately £37 million.

3. RESPONSIBILITY

The Board of Directors are committed to improving our practices to combat slavery and human trafficking and have overall responsibility for ensuring that this policy fulfils with our legal and ethical obligations and that compliance to the policy is upheld.

4. OUR MEASURES

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we have in place systems to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains.
- Monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains.
- Protect whistle blowers.

We use the following key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure how effective we have been to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in any part of our business or supply chains:
